We want to continue to provide our services and we want to keep both you, and our volunteers, safe.

We would be grateful for your support and understanding, whilst we continue to supply emergency food to those who need it most in these uncertain times.

The changes in the way we operate are as follows:

- We are no longer conducting face-to-face sessions so you need to contact us via phone or email in all cases. We are moving to a Pick-Up system where you can collect by car without entering the building
- Access to the foodbank is by referral. A list of the agencies who can issue you with a voucher can be found on our website - or please contact us for further information. Many agencies can now issue e-vouchers which are sent directly to us.
- Please call the number below and leave a clear message, with your name and number and we will call you back, take your details and discuss your circumstances to determine what
- If you cannot leave your home to pick-up, we will deliver to you, We'll ring or knock then step back to maintain distance
- Signposting, support and advice, will be via phone at this time

Tandridge Together Lottery is supporting local businesses and good causes with its new prize.
