### **Absence Procedure:**


Don't forget we have a new dedicated email address for absences:

### Ratios

- Children under 4 years old must be accompanied by a responsible adult in a ratio of 1:1 in the pool
- Children 4-7 yearsmust be accompanied by a responsible adult in a ratio of 1:2 in the pool
- Children 8-16 years can swim unaccompanied but a responsible adult must be present poolside for the duration of the session in a ratio of 1:4. If the group includes non-swimmers or weak swimmers the responsible adult is required to be in the pool supervising
- Children under 4 yearsit is strongly recommended that they wear flotation aids such as arm bands or bobbin jackets


