When parked in the car park, please don't leave your car engine running idly. This is a residential area and there are children crossing the roads. Parking irresponsibly can be dangerous as it can obscure the view for other road users. Please also bear in



mind that traffic wardens have been seen around this area and anyone parking on double yellow lines could incur a fine.
